A Book of Condolences

The church will be open daily from 9am to 4pm with a book available for your comments. On the parish website, there will be an online book from Monday 12th.

The Flag

The flag on the church tower will be flown at half-mast for the period of mourning.

There will be a flag flown on a temporary pole outside Sancroft Hall.

Formal Letter of Condolences

The Chair of the Parish Council has sent a letter to His Majesty King Charles III expressing sadness at the death of his mother and hope for his long reign as king. A copy will be sent to local newspapers and be put on the parish website.

Church Services

During the period of mourning, services in the three churches will be opportunities for anyone and everyone to give thanks for The Queen's exceptional life and legacy.
